- Our College won many Gold medals in sports at University/Inter-University level.

- NSS conducted many seminars and awareness programmes including a one day workshop on "Aids awareness" in collaboration with Red Ribbon Club.
- ❖ We have constructed 7 houses for the Homeless poor and two houses were renovated.
- ❖ The UGC has sanctioned Rs.6,00,000/- towards stipend for the poor students and Rs.46,00,000/- towards conveyance allowance to poor students and remedial/NET Coaching for minority students. The UGC has sanctioned Rs. 1.44 crore for the UG/PG development programmes.

- ❖ More than 100 units of blood was donated to the poor and needy and blood group identification was done to all first year students.

Seven houses were constructed for the homeless poor under the scheme "Home for the Homeless".

Nearly 100 students have donated blood to the sick admitted in hospitals at Marthandam, Nagercoil, Neyyoor, Parasala and Trivandrum.

130 poor and needy students were provided free lunch on every working day. Rs.40,000/- was given to deserving poor students to remit Exam Fee from Welfare Fund contributed by Staff and students.

Students visited Irenipuram Blind School and Neyyoor Cancer Centre and hosted lunch and supplied necessary things.

A one day workshop was conducted on AIDS awareness in collaboration with Red Ribbon Club.

Teachers contribute every month towards the treatment of poor at the Cancer Centre, Neyyoor. Also, we visited the AIDS affected children at CBH, Nagercoil and contributed Rs. 5000/- towards their medical treatment. We provided nutritious food and clothes to the blind students at Irenipuram.
