**How I Taught My Grandmother to Read-Sudha Murthy**

Sudha Murthy's How I Taught My Grandmother to Read is a heartwarming narrative that explores the transformative power of education and the significance of literacy in one's life.

The grandmother assured that she will work hard and would keep Saraswati Pooja day during Dassara as the deadline to learn the letters of the Kannada Alphabet. The narrator, inspired by her grandmother's determination, agreed to teach her.

The narrator became her grandmother's first teacher. The grandmother surprised the narrator on Dassara day by touching her feet, acknowledging her as a teacher who had helped her achieve literacy. The narrator gave her a copy of Kashi Yatre, which was later published as a novel, as a gift to her grandmother.

How I taught my Grandmother to Read, brings out the importance of education and the impact it can have on an individual's sense of independence and self-worth.
