- A language lab was planned and 20 computers were acquired for the same.
- The college got the new domain name www.nmcc.ac.in.
- The number of rank holders has increased from 31 to 56.
- Teachers participated in 11 refresher and orientation programs, 18 teachers took part in workshops and seminars.

- The college conducts Career Oriented Programs for which we received a grant of Rs. 1700000/- from the UGC.
- Plans have been drawn out to provide computer education to humanities students.
- 100 poor students are being given mid day meals.
- Plans have been made to strengthen the library by introducing net.
- 2 teachers were awarded PhD, and 11 went for FIP program.
- MBA students took part in 8 inter collegiate competition..
- BBA students took part in 3 inter collegiate competitions.
- Tourism students participated in inter collegiate state level seminar
- 35 students were placed during the current year.
