- > To improve the electricity situation by installing transformer inside the campus.
- > To improve the infrastructure of the department of Botany.

The outcome of the plan

- The Language lab was formally inaugurated by Prof. Pabhakar Babu, former Head of the Language Lab, CIEFL, Hyderabad. The Computer Center of the Department of Business application has also been turned into a makeshift as language lab.
- Prof. Prabakar Babu & Dr Dominic Savio of CIEFL, Hyderabad conducted a three day programme for junior members of the faculty.
- ❖ Broad Band Connection is provided in the Principal's office, Department of Computer Applications, the Department of Business Administration, the Department of Computer Science and the Department of Physics from which links are provided to the other departments.
- The Department of History which is a Research centre has produced three Ph.Ds. Three members of the faculty have been awarded their Ph.Ds, bring up the total of Ph.D. degree holders to 39. 11 technical papers have been published by members of the faculty.

- Seminar on Modern Literature was conducted by the Department of Tamil, which was addressed by Sahithya Academy Award winner Mr. Thopil Miran.
- ❖ A total of sixteen conferences, workshops and meet were conducted four of these were at the national level.
- Progress reports of each student was printed and distributed.
- ❖ The Library has been upgraded with books, journals, and CD's and to the tune of Rs 5 lacs. Donations in terms of Books to the library were initiated when 319 books of late Prof. C. Jesudasan, an UGC Awardee being presented by members of his family.
- The college has sent the proposal to the UGC to sanction Rs 1 crore towards a Women Hostel.
- ❖ In order to get over the water problem in summer, the college has drawn up a plan to acquire a piece of land near the Kuzhuthurai river, approximately 1Km from the college and pump the water to the institution. This is expected to meet the water requirement of the college for another 50 years.
- To avoid intermittent power cuts on campus and hence unnecessary wastage of fuel for generators, a transformer has been installed solely for the needs of the college.
- The Botany department has been modified with a new building keeping in mind room for research.

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

The mission and goals of the college have always been to impart and spread knowledge, to cultivate humanistic traits and to mould the intellectual, emotional and spiritual character of one's personality with a view to dispelling their ignorance and darkness. It is also to transforms the most backward people of Vilavancode and Kalkulam taluks of Kanyakumari District thereby uplifting them from their social backwardness. It is to make the rural folk realize their worth and potentiality and help them march forward.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG)

The MS University has granted affiliation for M.Phil. Physics, M.Phil. Mathematics & M.Sc. Botany.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction

The Audio Visual education has been strengthened. Communication classes have been started for MBA, BBA & B.A. Tourism departments along with leadership training classes. The library has a good collection of VCDs and DVDs which are used for language skills. Two more LCD Projectors have been added to the list of audio visual equipment. A

seminar on communication skills has been conducted by teachers from England. This along with the training by faculty from CIEFL and workshop on Soft Skills and Technical Writing have been conducted to improve communication skills of teachers and students of the college.

The Department of Computer Applications along with the Department of Management Studies have conducted inter collegiate seminars. The department of Tourism has also conducted inter collegiate competitions.

The Department of Physics has invited an expert from the Madurai University to give a seminar on 'Nano-technology'.

4. Inter- disciplinary programmes started

The Seminar on Nano Technology conducted by the Department of Physics along with Chemistry and the inter disciplinary competitions of the Department of Computer Applications and Management Studies like EUGINIX. were the inter disciplinary programmes.

Members of the faculty are members of various Boards of Studies and have advocated syllabus revision, and flexible syllabus in Senate and Syndicate meetings.
