- ❖ To conduct at least one International seminar every year.

Outcome of the Plan:

- ❖ We got affiliation to M.Phil. Botany and B.Com. (Computer Applications) Courses.
- ❖ Physics and Mathematics Departments have been upgraded into Research Departments.
- ❖ The proposal for M.Sc. Bio-informatics has been sent to UGC.
- ❖ Remedial Courses have been conducted for weak students in order to improve pass percentage. Good students are encouraged to perform better in the University exam. This year our students got 60 University ranks including 8 first ranks.
- ❖ A number of faculty members have registered for the Ph.D. Programme. Four of our faculty were awarded Ph.D. this year by Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli.
- ❖ The College encourages the staff to go for higher studies. Prof. Satheesh Sam of Computer Science Department has been granted leave to do Ph.D. at Anna University, Chennai.
- ❖ Eight of our faculty members attended Refresher/Orientation Courses.

- ❖ Twenty nine of our teachers attended more than 45 seminars and conferences at the National/International level.
- ❖ Sixty one papers were presented by our faculty members in National/International conferences. Of these, 25 papers were published in Journals.
- ❖ A minor project entitled “Red listed syngnathidae and related families along the south Indian (Tamil Nadu & Kerala) coast with special reference to the conservation aspects” in Botany was sanctioned by UGC.
- ❖ The Department of Management Studies conducted a consultancy project doing survey on the availability of bio fuel raw material in Kanyakumari District.
- ❖ A Tamil book written by Dr. C. Jesuraj has been prescribed as text book for students of Scott Christian College, Nagercoil (Autonomous).
- ❖ Four articles by Dr. Jeeva of Department of Botany were included in books published by various publishers.
