Marshal A. Nesamony, M.A., B.L. (Ex. M.P.)

Marshal A Nesamony, a statesman and lawyer, was born on 12 June, 1895 at Nesarpuram in Vilavancode Taluk, Kanyakumari district. He was educated at Scott Christian High School, Nagercoil and later graduated from The Maharaja's College, Thiruvananthapuram. He pursued law at the Law College, Thiruvananthapuram and began his legal profession in 1921.

Nesamony is remembered for his relentless service to the downtrodden section of society. He founded the Nagercoil Municipal Destitute Home and as a member of Travancore-Cochin Town and Country Planning he played the vital role in developing the rural areas. Furthermore, he printed and published the Tamil weekly 'Thingal'.

His Role in Public Life

- 1943-1947 : Chairman of the Nagercoil Municipality.
- 1945-1947 : Member of the Travancore Legislative Assembly.
- 1948-1952 : Member of the Travancore-Cochin Legislative Assembly and Leader of the Travancore Tamilnadu Congress Legislative Assembly Party.
- 1952-1957 : Member of Parliament (Lok Sabha), Nagercoil Constituency
- 1954-1957 : President of the Travancore Tamil Nadu Congress Party.
- 1957-1959 : President of the District Congress Committee.
- 1956 : Played a pivotal role in the merger of South Travancore (Kanniyakumari District) with Tamilnadu on 1st November.
- 1957-1962 : Member of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly.
- 1957-1962 : Member of the Reform of Local Administration in the State of Madras.
- 1962-1968 : Member of Parliament (Lok Sabha), Nagercoil Constituency.

His role in the KK Diocese of the Church of South India

- 1933-1947 : Secretary of the Travancore & Mission Church Councils.
 - 1934-1942 : Member of the South District Pastorate Council.
 - 1947-1960 : Vice-President of the South Travancore Diocesan Council, C.S.I. (Church of South India).
 - 1960-1968 : Vice-President of the K.K. Diocesan Council, C.S.I.
- He passed away on 1st June 1968.

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1. BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Nesamony Memorial Christian College is a prestigious academic and research institution that caters to the students' academic and personal development, by providing a highly professional and open-minded education rooted in ethics and values. The college, sprawled in a lush green campus, has an excellent infrastructure, library, indoor-outdoor stadium, hostel and internet facilities. The college offers science, humanities, commerce and management disciplines with well-equipped department libraries and classrooms. We have dedicated and erudite faculty members who help in grooming the students to become world-class citizens in this globally competitive world.

The college is affiliated to Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli, Tamil Nadu and is recognised under 2(f) and 12(B) by the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi.

The 32 acres of the land where the college is located was bought by Rev. James Emlyn, a missionary from Newcastle UK of the London Missionary Society. Rev. Robert Sinclair, who succeeded him in 1910, built a bungalow and started a Boarding School.

After independence, the Kanniyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India took into consideration the long-felt need for a College at Marthandam and decided to begin a Christian college. The Executive Committee of the Diocese, which met on 04-01-1964, entrusted the responsibility of raising funds for the buildings to an ad-hoc committee consisting of Mr. N. Dennis, Ex. MP(Convener), Mr. G.A. Ambrose, Mr. J. Nesamony, Mr. P.S. Wilson and Rev. M. Amos. The Diocese set apart the 32 acres as an endowment to fulfil the University requirement. The public, in and around Marthandam, the parents, students and members of the teaching and non-teaching staff took a keen interest in the growth of the College and contributed substantially at different stages in its development.

The Pre- University Class (PUC), with the permission of the Madras University, was started in 1964 with 13 teaching staff members and 171 students. The College was inaugurated on 6th August 1964 by the then Bishop Rt. Rev. I.R.H. Gnanadason with Dr. John D.K. Sundar Singh as the first Principal. Initially, the College was started as a men's College and it became a Co-Educational institution in the year 1977. The College introduced undergraduate courses with Mathematics, History and Economics as major subjects in the year 1965. In 1966, the college was affiliated with Madurai University which was later renamed Madurai Kamaraj University.

The College became a Post Graduate Institution in the year 1980-81 with the introduction of M.Sc. in Physics. A Ph.D. Research Centre in History was started in the year 1997 in the regular scheme. The College now offers 18 U.G., 15 P.G, 12 Ph.D. & 12 Certificate Courses. Currently, the college has about 3499 students, 201 teaching, 77 non-teaching staff members and a chaplain.

The College was affiliated to Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli in 1991. God has guided and blessed the college tremendously. With faith in the divine guidance and co-operation from the public, the College will continue to shine as a fruitful centre of learning. The College was renamed as Nesamony Memorial Christian College in recognition of the yeoman services rendered by the late Thiru. A. Nesamony, B.A.,B.L.,M.P. to the Kanniyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India in 1984.

The College was accredited with 'A' Grade awarded by the NAAC for the period 2014-2019. The college is ranked in the 42nd position in the NIRF rankings 2024.

A number of innovative programmes and projects are being carried out in this college to lift the downtrodden people of this area.

EMBLEM

The emblem of our college bears a Cross, a Church, a Palmyra tree, a Star, a Book and a Lotus flower. The Cross and the Church identify the college as a Christian institution and signify sacrifice, love and holiness. The Palmyra Tree, a distinct tree once the sustenance of this region symbolises the productive nature of the institution. The guiding star at the top calls us to guide people towards light and knowledge. The open Book signifies the liberating nature of knowledge and the Lotus, our national flower, symbolises knowledge and wisdom, which the students acquire on campus.

Our Motto- FAITH, ENDEAVOUR, POWER - embraces all these features.

2. ADMINISTRATION

Nesamony Memorial Christian College is owned and managed by the Kannyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India. The Executive Committee of the Diocese appoints the Principal of the College. The College Governing Board, constituted by the Diocese, makes all other appointments subject to the approval of the Executive Committee. The major financial and administrative policies of the College are formulated by the Governing Board. The general administration of the College is vested in the Principal. He is assisted by the Vice-Principal in the day-to-day administration of the College. In the absence of the Principal, the Vice-Principal or the authorized Professor in station shall be in charge of the routine affairs of the College.

The Principal shall be responsible for supervising the maintenance of the accounts and properties of the College in accordance with the rules stipulated by University, Government and Management.

The Head of the departments are responsible for the organization, co-ordination and smooth running of their departments.

6. FEE, CONCESSIONS & SCHOLARSHIPS

TUITION FEE

Each student is required to pay the entire fee prescribed for each semester in a single instalment.

The semester fees for the academic year is collected either before the reopening of the college or at the time of admission.

The special fee is non-refundable if a student fails to join the college or leaves after joining. The second instalment is collected in December.

UG students enrolled in aided courses are exempted from paying tuition fees.

The payment schedule for fees will be notified at the beginning of each semester. As per Tamil Nadu Education Rule 90(a), if a student fails to pay the fee on the designated day, a fine of Rs. 1 per day will be levied from the date of the fine implementation. If the student fails to remit the fee with the fine within 10 working days, their name will be struck off from the college rolls.

The college does not grant exemptions for fee payment, regardless of leave applications. If readmitted, the student must pay the outstanding fee, fine, and an additional readmission fee of Rs. 5. Students holding fee concessions and scholarships are also subject to these regulations.

CONCESSIONS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

The management and both state and central governments have extended their support to students in various forms to assist them in their studies. Eligibility criteria for availing scholarships will be announced through notices to the students when required. Scholarship forms will be provided to students at the college office in a timely manner. These scholarships and concessions can only be applied by the students who have paid the full fee for the first semester and enrolled in the college. Students availing scholarships and fee concessions must maintain a minimum attendance of 75% in all semesters.

GOOD SAMARITAN FREE EDUCATION

The College provides free education to 10 selected students coming from below the poverty line and outstanding sports persons.

STATE GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

a) BC/MBC/DNC SCHOLARSHIPS

The application submission period for BC/MBC/DNC scholarships is from July to August.

Eligibility criteria

Undergraduate, Postgraduate, or M.Phil. aided students belonging to the BC, MBC, or BCM category.

There is no income limit for undergraduate students. However, for postgraduate and M.Phil. students, the parental annual income limit for availing the BC/MBC/DNC scholarship should be below Rs. 2.50 lakhs.

The Government of Tamil Nadu has launched the Moovalur Ramamirtham Ammaiyar Higher Assurance Scheme to enhance the enrolment ratio of girls from Government schools to Higher Education Institutions. Under this scheme, eligible girls will receive a monthly financial assistance of Rs. 1000 until they complete their UG degree. The incentive amount will be disbursed directly into the student's Bank Account

- Scholars with an M.Phil. qualification must be in their first or second year of the Ph.D. course.
- They should have secured at least 60% marks in their postgraduate degree.
- They should not be receiving any other scholarship.
- Part-time Ph.D. research scholars are not eligible for this scholarship.
- Selected research scholars, based on merit as determined by the Directorate, will receive an amount of Rs. 5000/- per month.

h) TAMIL PUDHALVAN SCHEME

Eligibility Criteria

All male students who enrolled in Tamil Medium from class VI to XII from government and government aided schools who are pursuing higher education.

i) PUDHUMAI PENN SCHEME

Eligibility Criteria

All female students who enrolled in Tamil Medium from class VI to XII from government and government aided schools who are pursuing higher education.

NATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

a) SCHEME OF 'POST-MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP' FOR STUDENTS BELONGING TO THE MINORITY COMMUNITIES

Eligibility

Scholarship will be awarded to the students who have secured not less than 50% marks or equivalent grade in the previous final

examination and the annual income of whose parents/guardians from all sources does not exceed Rs. 2.00 lakhs.

STUDENT AID FUND

The student aid fund is generated from a student aid fee of Rs. 2/- collected from each student. This fund is intended to provide financial assistance to deserving students who are unable to meet their examination fees, a small part of tuition fees, purchase essential books for their studies, clothing or medical expenses.

Meritorious yet economically disadvantaged students who wish to benefit from this fund can apply to the Principal through their Head of Department.

The selection process for the fund recipients involves the recommendations of the HOD and the advice of an advisory body consisting of students and staff representatives. The Principal, considering the beneficiary's academic performance, conduct, character, and financial status, administers the fund.

In addition to the student aid fund, Prof. A.J. Harris has instituted an amount of Rs. 4000/- to extend aid to the deserving students.

FREE MID-DAY MEAL SCHEME

The college offers free mid-day meal scheme for poor students on working days, with contributions from staff, students, well-wishers, and the management. The provision of free mid-day meals greatly benefits poor students. It has a significant positive impact on students.

The interest from various endowment funds such as Rev. Harris Memorial Endowment (Rs. 1000/-), Miss. Isaacs Endowment (Rs. 1000/-), and the Endowment (Rs. 7,000/-) instituted by the College Students Council of 1978-79 are also available for supporting the deserving students.

7. CAMPUS FACILITIES AND STUDENTS' AMENITIES

a) Library and Book Bank

The Library Block is located on the first floor of the Emlyn Block, the eastern part of the campus. It houses a diverse collection of approximately 62,400 volumes covering various disciplines. The library offers subscriptions to 11 daily newspapers, over 40 journals, periodicals and magazines spanning a wide range of subjects, in addition to the e-resources through INFLIBNET N-LIST programme. Reading materials are available in three languages, viz Tamil, Malayalam and English.

The general reading room can accommodate nearly 100 readers simultaneously, and a dedicated reference section is maintained for research scholars. Open access is granted to all students. The library operates on all working days from 9:15 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and during vacations, it remains open on Wednesdays

Undergraduate students belonging to socially and educationally backward classes can benefit from the Book Bank Facilities. They can borrow books from the library for an entire semester and are only required to return them after the semester examinations.

Every student in the college is eligible for library membership. By showing their identity card at the library counter, students can borrow books. Borrowed books must be returned within fifteen calendar days. Failure to do so will result in an overdue charge of 25 paise per day. If a book is not in high demand, it can be renewed for an additional fifteen days by presenting it at the counter. Each borrower is personally responsible for the borrowed books, and they should be handled with utmost care. In the event of any damage, the borrower must either replace the book or pay for its cost along with additional charges for overdue items.

The library is equipped with an ample number of computers providing internet access. Students can utilise this facility free of charge. Reference books and periodicals are available only for reference within the library premises. It is essential to maintain strict silence while using the library and reading room.

b) Internet

Wi-Fi internet facilities are available to staff and students on campus.

c) Students' Bookstore

The purpose of the Students' Bookstore is to provide text books and notebooks to students on time. The cost of books that have not been issued to students will be refunded at the end of the year.

Students are advised to check their individual account cards maintained in the bookstore before closing their accounts for the year. Any outstanding costs of books, if not issued, should be settled immediately before obtaining the Transfer Certificate. Students are instructed to note down the cost of books they receive for future reference.

d) Students' Christian Movement

The Students' Christian Movement (SCM) caters to the spiritual needs of Protestant Christian students in the College. With the Principal as the Patron, the activities are guided by the Chaplain supported by Staff Advisors and a secretary along with student representatives from each class.

The SCM conducts morning worship sessions during working days. A special meeting is organised every Tuesday. They regularly conduct hospital visits, contribute to the welfare of Blind School Students, Cancer Patients, and AIDS Victims, and organise Carol rounds during Christmas.

e) Christian Education Council Diploma Class

The Christian Education Council Diploma class was established in our college in the year 1991. The syllabus for first-year students covers the New Testament, while the second-year curriculum focuses on the Old Testament, and the third-year curriculum delves into Christian Faith. Classes are held every Wednesday evening, and the annual examination takes place in the month of March.

f) Centre for Advanced Language Lab / Computing(CAC) Lab

The Language Laboratory has been operational since 2008. The computer-aided lab assists students in enhancing their communication skills. Training is provided to all students in a phased manner. The new digital language lab has 80 computers with all needed facilities for enhancing the communication skills of the learners.



8. RULES & REGULATIONS

a) General Discipline

1. It is mandatory for every student to adhere to the rules and regulations of the College and uphold its discipline with respect.
2. All the students are required to wear their identity cards at all times while on college premises.
3. All the students on campus are required to maintain a neat and tidy appearance at all times, including during examinations.
4. College Uniform is mandatory for students on all working days, except for the last working day of each month.

Male students are permitted only to wear formal shirts and pants within the campus. They are prohibited from wearing short shirts, multicoloured shirts with pictures, multi-pocket pants, jeans, T-shirts, or dhotis.

Female students should dress modestly, refraining from wearing transparent dresses, half sarees, Anarkali churidars, churidars with an umbrella cut, leggings, or Capri pants. They are expected to wear churidars with lengthy tops below knee level, ensuring their dupatta is neatly pinned in a "V" shape.
5. The colouring or bleaching of hair is strictly prohibited for both male and female students.
6. Male students must have properly trimmed hair and maintain a clean-shaven face. Wearing slippers, bangles, bracelets, rings, or studs in the ears are not allowed.
7. Students are expected to exhibit respectful behaviour towards teachers, fellow students, and others, reflecting the values of integrity and courtesy. Any indecent behaviour will be addressed with utmost seriousness.
8. Students should move quietly between classrooms and maintain discipline.
9. Students should be punctual and attend classes on time, seating themselves according to their class number.
10. Leaving the classroom or laboratory without permission from the teacher-in-charge is not permitted.
11. Latecomers may enter the classroom or laboratory only with the permission of the teacher-in-charge. (Attendance cannot be claimed)
12. It is the responsibility of every student to ensure the cleanliness and safety of the College building and its property. Any deliberate damage to the college property will be subjected to serious consequences.
13. Students are strictly prohibited from organising or attending meetings, distributing notices or handbills, or collecting money for any purpose within the College premises without obtaining prior permission from the Principal.

14. Students shall not address any authority in a collective petition or lodge complaints with any other body. All requests, petitions, complaints, and appeals should be directed to the Principal.
15. Smoking, alcohol consumption, and the use of intoxicating drinks or drugs are strictly prohibited.
16. The College authorities shall not be held accountable for any misconduct or criminal offences that take place outside the College premises. Students are expected to maintain appropriate behaviour even beyond the College grounds in order to uphold the College's esteemed reputation.
17. Under any circumstances, boys are strictly prohibited from entering the premises of the girls' retiring room.
18. Eve-teasing and ragging are strictly prohibited on campus. Any student found engaging in eve-teasing or ragging will face legal consequences.
19. Students are prohibited from wearing smartwatches or bringing mobile phones to campus. Any violation of this rule will be subjected to serious consequences.
20. The students are strictly warned against uploading and sharing controversial content that goes against the interests of the college on social media platforms such as Facebook, Instagram, WhatsApp, YouTube, etc. If violated strict action will be taken.

Any student who:

- i) demonstrates persistent insubordination,
- ii) consistently shows irregular attendance or lack of attentiveness to their work in class,
- iii) engages in repeated or deliberate mischievous or obscene behaviour,
- iv) is found guilty of fraud or misconduct in examinations,
- v) participates in political agitations or any movement that causes social discord, will face temporary or permanent removal from the institution, depending on the severity of the offence.

b) Issue of Certificates

Transfer Certificates will only be issued to students who have settled all their dues before leaving the Institution. Certificate (Transfer, conduct, etc.) will be issued within a week from the date of application.

The Principal will not issue a certificate of pass for any University Examination.

Fees for issue of certificates:

- a) Duplicate Transfer Certificate: Rs. 500
- b) Bonafide Certificate Rs. 50
- c) Any Information/Certificates from the college records (for passed out students) - Rs. 100 +search fee.

c) Attendance and Leave Policy

1. Students are required to maintain regular attendance in all classes, including theory and practical sessions, as well as in activities such as Games, NCC, NSS, and other part V subjects, as stated by the rules of the University and College.
2. Prior approval for leave must be obtained by submitting a leave application form available at the office. The application should be addressed to the Vice-Principal/Principal through the Head of the Department.
3. Failure to submit a leave application will result in a fine. In case of unforeseen and unavoidable circumstances, the leave applications shall be submitted immediately on return after an absence.
4. Attendance is recorded at the beginning of each class period. If a student is absent for one class, either in the morning or evening, it will be considered as a half-day absence.
5. Students who remain absent from the College for more than 15 consecutive working days without a satisfactory explanation may be removed from the rolls.
6. Leave applications for illness should be countersigned by the parents or guardian. Applications for sick leave exceeding three days should be accompanied by a medical certificate.
7. No student will be exempted from tests or assignments.
8. Fee concession holders and scholarship holders must maintain a minimum attendance of 90% as per G.O. 666 of 24.4.1979.
9. Each student is responsible for monitoring their attendance percentage and ensuring compliance with the University's attendance requirements.
10. A minimum attendance of 75 percent is required for regular students to be eligible to appear for the end-semester examination. However, students who have an attendance between 60% and 74% due to genuine reasons such as medical issues, sports participation, accidents, etc., may be allowed to appear for the examination by submitting the required medical or other certificates duly endorsed by the Head of the Department or Principal. They must also pay the prescribed Condonation fee set by the University. Condonation for attendance shortage can be sought once during the entire course of study, with a maximum consideration of 15 days.
11. Students with less than 59% attendance during a semester will be required to repeat the semester.
12. Since the academic year 2017-18, the University has introduced a break system, which implies that students who repeat a semester are not allowed to continue with the course.

9. STUDENTS' COUNCIL

Students' Council Constitution

ARTICLE-1: Aim

- A. The aim of the Council is to help students engage in meaningful pursuits outside the co-curricular program of the College and provide opportunities for training as good citizens.
- B. The Council will try to achieve these aims mainly through debates, lectures, meetings, and cultural programs.

ARTICLE-II: Membership

All students of the College are deemed members of the Council for the academic year, and all members of the staff are honorary members.

ARTICLE-III: Office Bearers of the Executive Committee

- A. The Principal is the President of the Council. He appoints three members of the staff to the Executive Committee of the Council, out of whom one staff member will be the Treasurer, and the other two will serve as the Advisors.
- B. There will be an elected Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and Joint-Secretary for the Council.
- C. The Chairman will preside over regular meetings of the Council. The Principal or the Vice-Principal will preside over business and special meetings of the Council, as well as the meetings of the Executive Committee.
- D. The secretary will arrange the meetings of the Council in consultation with the President and Chairman, and will conduct other matters of the Council according to the decisions made by the President and the Executive Committee of the Council.

Two other students will be co-opted to the Committee upon nomination by the Principal, in order to ensure fair representation.

Article-IV : Election

Mode of Election

The college, abiding by the rules of Manonmaniam Sundaranar University guidelines (No. MSU/A/CO.IN.EL/2007-08), has adopted an indirect election method for electing the office bearers and executive members of the Students' Union Council. Each class, including undergraduates, postgraduates, and M.Phil. students, elects a representative. These class representatives form the electoral college to directly elect the office bearers and executive members.

Under the proposed system, the apex body will be the "University Students' Union." The electoral college for the Union will consist of students' representatives selected from affiliated colleges and university departments, including a Chairman and Secretary. Additionally, there will be four office bearers as in colleges, and two student representatives from each of the districts Tirunelveli, Tuticorin, and Kanyakumari, resulting in a total of six representatives for the Executive Committee.

Eligibility to Contest :

1. The student must be a regular full-time student.
2. The student should have cleared all papers until the date of nomination.
3. The student must have maintained a minimum attendance of 75% in the previous semester.
4. Contesting candidates should not have any criminal charges or affiliation with any political or communal organizations.
5. The candidates should not have any charges of indiscipline.
6. All students of the college have the right to vote and contest in the election of the Students' Council. Candidates for the positions of Chairman and Secretary must be from either the third year of undergraduate classes, or the second year of postgraduate classes, or M.Phil. classes.
7. Students elected as Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Joint-Secretary, and Executive Committee Members of the Council are not allowed to hold office in any other association within the college. They must resign from any previously elected offices they may hold.

8. First-year undergraduate and postgraduate students are not eligible to become members of the Executive Committee.
9. The elections for Chairman, Vice-chairman, Secretary, Joint-Secretary, and student members of the Executive Committee will be conducted by the President or an Advisor appointed by the President. Generally, the elections will be held using a secret ballot.
10. A student who is identified as guilty and fined Rs. 50/- will be ineligible to participate in any of the Students' Council elections.

Grievance Cell

The staff council has formed a Grievance Cell that will efficiently handle any election-related disputes and complaints within a 24-hour period. The Grievance Cell is empowered to disqualify any contestant who violates the election norms by cancelling their candidature.

Code of Conduct

- There will be a strict prohibition on any election-related expenditure, and engaging in corrupt practices is strictly forbidden.
- The use of wall posters, pamphlets, and handbills is banned.
- No outsiders will be permitted on the day of the election process.
- Processions of any kind, in any location, are strictly prohibited.
- If any violence or factional clashes occur, the President will take the decision to cancel the entire election process and inform the relevant University authority.

Deadline for Elections

The election process in a college should be concluded within a maximum duration of four days.

The election for the University Students' Union must be completed prior to December 20, 2024

ARTICLE-V: Meetings of the Executive Committee

- A. The Executive Committee of the Council will hold discussions on the program of activities at least once per semester.
- B. The Secretary will provide a notice of at least three days for Committee meetings. In case of urgency or special circumstances, the President has the authority to call for meetings on short notice.
- C. All meetings of the Committee will be recorded to maintain a record of proceedings.
- D. The quorum for the Executive meeting will be set at fifty percent.
- E. The President retains the right to convene the Executive Committee of the Council at any given time. The President possesses the power to issue directives for the proper conduct of meetings and other Council affairs, including the authority to revise regulations. The President's interpretation of the regulations and decisions made in any dispute shall be considered final.

CODE OF CONDUCT OF THE ELECTED STUDENTS

(As per the proceedings of the Director of Collegiate Education, No. 5763116/82, dated 29-9-82.)

The office-bearers of the Students' Council must fully cooperate with the Principal and Staff of the College in promoting intellectual and cultural activities among students.

The Students' Council office-bearers shall assume responsibility for not engaging in any acts of indiscipline that disrupt normal campus life.

Problems and issues within the College should be resolved through representations and negotiations rather than resorting to other methods.

The office-bearers should not consider it their duty to represent matters or causes that fall outside the purview of the Council.

Office-bearers may make representations to the Principal only on matters of general interest to the students, not individual cases.

The Council office-bearers shall not directly or indirectly interfere in disciplinary matters and actions, as these are the responsibilities of the Principal.

Decisions regarding the activities/programs of the Council shall not be made solely by the Council office-bearers. They should be made in consultation with the Students' Representatives Council, consisting of Department Association office-bearers and Staff Advisers, and with the approval of the Principal.

The Council office-bearers, in consultation with the Students' Representatives Council and the Staff Advisers, shall prepare the budget for the Council. The budget must be submitted to the Principal for approval.

It is mandatory for the Council office-bearers to present the Union's statement of accounts twice per semester to the Students' Representatives Council.

The office-bearers must obtain the approval and consent of the Principal before inviting any outsiders to the College for meetings and functions.

The Council office-bearers shall not engage in any fundraising campaigns without specific approval from the Principal.

The aforementioned instructions must be followed, and appropriate action will be taken against those who violate them.

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced in the Undergraduate (UG) and Postgraduate (PG) programmes in Tamil Nadu from the academic year 2008-2009. The Tamil Nadu State Council for Higher Education (TANSCHÉ) implemented uniform curriculum across all universities in the state from the academic year 2023-2024. Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, in compliance with TANSCHÉ's regulations, made significant revisions to the curriculum for the first-year UG and PG students.

The curriculum primarily consists of Core Courses, Elective Courses and Project work / Internship.

12. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The college offers Curricular, Co-curricular and Extracurricular activities to enhance campus life and mould students into mature individuals. Students can enrol their names in committees related to their interests, whether academic, cultural, sports-oriented, or community service-focused, enabling them to pursue their passion and develop leadership skills. NSS/NCC/YRC/SPORTS are part of the curriculum and it is mandatory for the students to choose one from the above under PART V. The College offers a range of activities, including the following:

(a) National Cadet Corps (N.C.C.) (Company III)

The 11th battalion company of the NCC, with its headquarters in Nagercoil, has a strength of 160 cadets. This mixed battalion comprises both boys and girls and has been operational for the past five years. The primary aims of the N.C.C. include:

The main objective of the N.C.C. is to instil in the youth the qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, a spirit of adventure, sportsmanship, and the ideals of selfless service. Through the cultivation of these values, the N.C.C. aims to shape the youth into responsible citizens who can make positive contributions to society.

NCC also aims to develop a well-prepared and motivated group of young individuals who can take on leadership roles in different fields, including the armed forces. The idea is to make them consistently available for national service whenever the need arises.

The N.C.C. training typically spans two years, although it may be extended for an additional year in exceptional cases. The training encompasses a range of activities, including drill exercises with or without arms, weapon training, map reading, bayonet fighting, rifle and light machine gun firing, elementary military field tactics, and the study of army organisation and related subjects. Certain cadets are chosen to participate in special events such as the Annual Training Camp, Summer Training Camp, Advanced Leadership Training Camp, Republic Day Parade, Mountaineering Courses, and Attachment to Army Units, providing them with unique opportunities for further development.

There will be a total of 40 parades per year, and it is mandatory for all cadets to attend them. Punctuality, maintaining a neat appearance, and actively participating with discipline are expected from every cadet. Based on their proficiency, cadets will have the opportunity to appear for B and C Certificate examinations.

(b) National Service Scheme - N.S.S.

There are six N.S.S. units, namely Unit Nos. 82, 83, 135, 139, 188, and 189, operating under the Youth Welfare Department of Manonmaniam Sundaranar University. Each unit is composed of 100 authorised student members. The objectives of the N.S.S. are as follows:

- To work with and among people.

- To engage in creative and constructive social action.

- To make National Service more meaningful and purposeful and integrate it with the curriculum.

- To provide students with an opportunity to participate in nation-building tasks.

- To instil a sense of national consciousness in the minds of the students.

Enrolment in the N.S.S program is open to degree students with a positive attitude and a genuine interest in working with and for the underprivileged. It is important for the students to have a clear understanding of the objectives and responsibilities associated with the program. The enrolment process will be completed before 1st August of every academic year.

A college-level N.S.S committee is established under the chairmanship of the Principal, with a designated Programme Officer serving as the Convenor. The committee consists of no more than 10 members, including senior staff members, students, and community members interested in the program. This Advisory Committee collaborates to plan the activities and programs for the academic year, and a minute book is maintained to record the proceedings of the committee.

The N.S.S. program officers will provide further details regarding the projects and programs.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA) - Village Adoption

As part of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), NMCC has adopted the villages of Alancode near Vavarai, Kannanvilai near Kollenchi, Mankalakuntu near Midalam in Killiyoor Taluk, Kumarankudi, and Surulacode near Thiruvattar in Thiruvattar Taluk. These villages face significant social and economic challenges and are considered underprivileged in terms of development. The objectives behind adopting these villages are as follows:

- To conduct community development programs.

- To encourage adult education and literacy programs.

- To conduct environmental awareness programs.

- To conduct social work camps with the help of NGOs.

- To make the people aware of government welfare schemes.

- To organise health and hygiene awareness camps.

- To provide education to the local people on numerous rights.

- To create awareness among the people about consumer problems.

(c) Youth Red Cross

Youth Red Cross unit is a platform that allows young students to play an active role in humanitarian efforts. The objective is to expand their knowledge and develop skills that will be beneficial not only for their academic journey but also for their future careers as responsible global citizens.

The Youth Red Cross' primary objective is to educate and train student volunteers to provide humanitarian services and address the health needs of the sick and suffering. Furthermore, it encourages students to donate blood voluntarily. The aim is to involve college students in humanitarian activities, develop a sense of volunteerism, and increase awareness about health and social issues.

YRC conducts health awareness programs and workshops that cover topics such as sanitation, hygiene, nutrition, and disease prevention. The benefits of these initiatives extend beyond students to the wider community. Their mission is to educate both students and the community by organizing awareness campaigns on significant social issues, which may include topics such as HIV/AIDS prevention or environmental conservation. YRC provides college students with essential first aid training, which will enable them to respond effectively to medical emergencies in their communities and beyond.

(d) Sports

Sports help students to stay physically fit and healthy. Students can improve their skills for their personal growth and future career opportunities. They promote physical and mental well-being, encourage social interaction, and contribute to personal development. The sports committee plays a crucial role in boosting the college's sports culture. They organise a variety of events, inter-college tournaments, and friendly matches. These events not only let students display their skills and strengthen bonds within the college but also provide chances to represent the college at the university level, offering greater recognition and opportunities in the sports world.

Enrolment

Enrolment is open to the UG students under Part V in the curriculum. It is important for the students to have a clear understanding of the objectives and responsibilities associated with the programmes. The enrolment process will be completed in the month of August. A college-level committee is established under the chairmanship of the Principal, with a dedicated team of staff members.
