Born on 12-06-1895 at Nesarpuram, Vilavancode Taluk, Kanniyakumari District.

Graduated at The Maharaja's College, Thiruvananthapuram and studied Law at the Law College, Thiruvananthapuram. Started his Legal Profession in 1921.

- 1948-1952 : Member of Travancore - Cochin
Legislative Assembly
- 1952-1957 : Member of Parliament, Nagercoil Constituency

- 1955 : Elected as President of Travancore,
Tamil Nadu Congress Party
- 1956 : The Yeoman service rendered
by him ultimately paved the way
for the merger of the South Travancore
(Kanniyakumari District) with Tamil Nadu.
- 1957-1962 : Member of Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly

- 1933-1947 : Secretary, Travancore & Mission Church Councils
- 1934-1942 : South District Pastorate Council
- 1947-1960 : Vice-President, South Travancore Diocesan
Council, C.S.I.

Passed away on 1st June 1968.

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1. BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Foundation

In the year 1868, **Rev. James Emlyn** from New Castle, U.K., an LMS missionary bought the land where the College is located now. **Rev. Robert Sinclair**, who succeeded **Rev. James Emlyn** in the year 1910, built a bungalow and started a Boarding School on the campus measuring 32 acres.

After independence the long felt need for a College at Marthandam resulted in the starting of the Christian College in June 1964 by the Kannyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India. The Executive Committee of the Diocese, which met on 04-01-1964, entrusted the responsibility of raising funds for the buildings needed to an adhoc committee consisting of Messrs. **N. Dennis**, Ex. MP (Convener) **G.A. Ambrose**, **J. Nesamony**, **P.S. Wilson** and **Rev. M. Amose**. The Diocese set apart sufficient extent of wet lands as endowment to satisfy the University requirement. The public, in and around Marthandam, the parents, students and members of the teaching and non-teaching staff took keen interest in the growth of the College and contributed substantially at different stages for its development.

With the permission of the **Madras University** the Pre-University Class (PUC) was started in 1964 with 171 students. The College was inaugurated on **the 6th of August 1964** by the then Bishop **Rt. Rev. I.R.H. Gnanadason**, with **Dr. John D.K. Sundar Singh** as the first Principal. Initially, the College was started as a men's College and it became a Co-Educational College in 1977. In June 1965, the College introduced undergraduate courses with **Mathematics, History** and **Economics** as major subjects. From the year 1966, the College was an affiliated Institution of the **Madurai University** which was later renamed as **Madurai Kamaraj University**. The College became a Post Graduate Institution in the year 1980-81 with the introduction of **M.Sc. in Physics**. A **Ph.D. Research Centre in History** was started in the year 1997 in the regular scheme. The College now offers **20 U.G., 15 P.G, 12 M.Phil., 12 Ph.D. & 11 Certificate Courses**. The present strength of students is **4081**. At present **197** teaching, **91** non-teaching staff members and a Chaplain are working in the College.

In the year 1991, the College became an affiliated College of the then newly formed **Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli**. In the marvelous growth of the College, God has guided and blessed us immensely. With faith in divine, guidance and co-operation from the public, it is hoped that the College will grow further into a fruitful centre of learning.

The College is an accredited Institution with 'A' Grade awarded by the NAAC for the period 2014-2019.

In June 1984, the College was re-named as **Nesamony Memorial Christian College** in recognition of the yeoman services rendered by the late Thiru. **A. Nesamony**, M.A.,B.L. to the Kannyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India.

The Emblem

The emblem of our College bears a Cross, a Church, a Palmyrah Tree, a Star, a Book and a Lotus Flower.

The Cross shows that our College is a Christian Institution. The Church signifies sanctification, as we get sanctified through prayer. The Palmyrah Tree is a special feature of the district. Every part of it is useful in our daily life. At the top there is a Star which stands for guidance. We look up to Him whenever we are in need of guidance. The open Book and the Lotus, our National flower, symbolise knowledge and wisdom respectively, which we impart to our dear students on the campus. Our motto - **FAITH, ENDEAVOUR, POWER** - embraces all these features.

Vision

To make this College a centre with potential for excellence by imparting quality education to find new paths for the prosperity and progress of the people.

Mission

Uplifting and empowering the poor and downtrodden of this rural and backward area by providing value based and skill oriented higher education.

For the last 57 years, this Institution has been striving hard to achieve this goal. A number of innovative programmes and projects are being carried out in this College to lift the downtrodden people of this area. We hope that in the near future Nesamony Memorial Christian College, Marthandam, will accomplish its basic goal.

2. ADMINISTRATION

The Nesamony Memorial Christian College is owned and managed by the Kanniyakumari Diocese of the Church of South India. The Executive Committee of the Diocese appoints the Principal of the College. The College Governing Board, constituted by the Diocese, makes all other appointments subject to the approval of the Executive Committee. The major financial and administrative policies of the College are formulated by the Governing Board. The general administration of the College is vested in the Principal. He is assisted by the Vice-Principal in the day-to-day administration of the College. In the absence of the Principal, the Vice-Principal or the authorized Professor in station shall be in charge of the routine affairs of the College.

The Principal shall be responsible for supervising the maintenance of the accounts and properties of the College in accordance with the rules stipulated by the University, the Government and the Management.

The Heads of Departments will be responsible to the Principal for the organization, co-ordination and smooth running of their departments.

6. FEES, CONCESSIONS & SCHOLARSHIPS

TUITION FEES

Every student has to pay the whole fees prescribed for each semester in one instalment.

The semester fees for the academic year will be collected before reopening or at the time of admission, the special fees will not be refunded if the student fails to join the College or leaves after joining. The second instalment will be collected in December. There is no Tuition Fee for UG Students of aided courses.

The Schedule for payment of fees will be notified at the beginning of every semester.

According to the Tamil Nadu Education Rule 90(a) "if a student fails to pay his/her fee on the day fixed for payment, a fine at the rate of Re. 1 per day has to be collected from the date of implementing the fine. If thereafter a student fails to remit his /her fees with fine within 10 working days, his/her name has to be removed from the rolls. Absence from College with or without leave applications offers no ground for exemption with regard to fee payment. If readmitted, he/ she must pay in addition to the fees and fine due from him/her and a readmission fee of Rs. 5. Holders of fee concession and scholarships of any kind are also bound by all the above regulations.

CONCESSIONS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

The Management and the Governments, both the state and the Central, have come forward to help students in their study in various forms. Eligibility conditions for availing scholarship will be announced as and when needed through notices to the students. Scholarship forms will be issued to students at the College Office in time. These scholarships and concessions should be applied for only after the students pay the first semester fees in full and enroll in the College. All those who avail scholarships and fee concession must secure 75% of the attendance in all the semesters.

Good Samaritan Free Education

The College provides free education to 10 deserved students coming from below poverty line and 7 outstanding sports persons.

SCHOLARSHIPS

- i) **Adhi Dhravida Scholarship** for the Hindu Scheduled Caste Scheduled Tribe students. Income limit is Rs. 200000/-per annum.
- ii) **Govt. of India Scholarship for the Differently Abled and the Blind.**
Income limit is Rs. 50000/- per annum.
- iii) **National Scholarship for meritorious Students**

iv) **Scholarship for first generation graduates ;**

This Scholarship is given to students who come from families where there are no graduates and whose parental income does not exceed Rs. 50000/- per annum. This is given to students of U.G. courses till the completion of the course. If they break their studies they should refund the whole amount they received from the Government.

v) **Nagammar fee concession :**

This fee concession is awarded to all P.G. girl students belonging to backward classes and girls of Nair community whose parents' annual income does not exceed Rs. 24000/-. They should continue their studies till the completion of the course lest they should refund the concession amount to the Government Income certificate obtained from the Tahsildar should be submitted every year to the college.

vi) **Dependants of Ex. Servicemen** can apply through the D.S.S.A. Board.

vii) The incentive for **Tamil Medium** degree Students will be Rs. 400/- as per the Government rules.

OTHER STATE GOVT. SCHOLARSHIPS

i) Department of Adhi Dravida Welfare awards scholarships to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe students including converts whose parents' annual income does not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/- These students should not avail of Govt. of India Post Merit Scholarship.

ii) State Govt. Scholarship for **Differently-abled** and **the Blind**.

iii) Department of **Backward Classes** awards scholarships to all **B.C.** and **M.B.C.** students. Income limit for B.C is Rs. 2,00,000/- per annum. Students of M.B.C. have no income limit.

iv) **Fee concession is available for the wards of farmers having identity card.**

Eligible students get the forms from the college office. **Filled in application forms accompanied by attested copies of Income and Community certificates** signed by the Tahsildar, **should be submitted before the 25th of July.**

The Community Certificate should agree with the Community mentioned in the S.S.L.C. Book. Incomplete application forms will be rejected.

3. Govt. of India Scholarship for Minority Students.
4. Management Scholarship for Blind Students (For SF also)

The amount of Scholarships for the first two is determined on the basis of the available funds and the number of beneficiaries. The third one is given to Christian / Muslim Students.

STUDENT AID FUND

The student aid fund is generated from the student aid fee of Rs. 2/- collected from each student. This will be available in the form of cash for poor deserving students to meet examination fee, a small part of tuition fee, cost of specific books essential for their study, clothing or medical expenses.

Meritorious but poor students who wish to avail of this fund, can apply to the Principal through their HoD. Based on the recommendations of the HoD and the advice of the advisory body consisting of students and staff representatives, the Principal will administer the fund. In addition to the financial status and academic performance, the conduct and character of the beneficiary will also be an important determining factor in the selection of students who benefit from the above fund.

The interest of the endowment amount of Rs. 4000/- instituted by Prof. A.J. Harris is available for the purpose of extending aid for the deserving students.

FREE MID-DAY MEAL SCHEME

With the contribution by the staff, students, well wishers and the Management, the College provides free mid-day meals on working days to a limited number of poor students. More students could benefit if the fund is increased.

The interest of the endowment funds like Rev. Harris Memorial Endowment (Rs. 1000/-) Miss. Isaacs Endowment (Rs. 1000/-) (both were instituted in the beginning stage of NMCC) and the Endowment (Rs. 7,000/-) instituted by the College Students Council of 1978-79 are also available for the above purpose.

Other Student Support Schemes :

- * Management Scholarship for poor Students
- * Financial help for attending seminar, paper presentation etc.

7. CAMPUS FACILITIES AND STUDENTS' AMENITIES

A) Library and Book Bank

The Library Block is functioning in the eastern part (First Floor) of the Emlyn Block. The library has a collection of about **61500** volumes in all disciplines. The Library subscribes to **11** dailies, and more than **55** Journals and Magazines in almost all subjects besides general periodicals. Being a bilingual area, reading materials are provided in three languages viz. Tamil, Malayalam & English. The general reading room can accommodate nearly 100 readers at a time. A reference section is maintained especially for research scholars. Open access is given to all students. The Library is kept open on all working days from 9.15 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. During vacation the library is kept open on all Wednesdays.

U.G. Students who belong to the socially and educationally backward classes can avail book bank facilities. They can borrow books from the library for a whole semester which they need to return only after the semester examinations.

Every student in the College is eligible for membership in the Library. On production of the Identity Card at the Library counter, books will be issued to the students. The books borrowed from the Library should be returned within fifteen calendar days, failing which an overdue charge of 25 paise per day will be collected. If the book is not on demand, it will be renewed for another fifteen days. For renewal, the book should be presented at the counter. Each borrower of a book is personally responsible for the book from the Library. Books are to be handled very carefully. If any book is damaged, it should either be replaced or its cost be paid with an additional cost along with overdue charges.

Sufficient number of computers are installed in the Library with internet facility. Students can avail this facility at free of cost.

Reference books and periodicals are available only for reference in the Library. Strict silence should be maintained in the Library and reading room.

(B) Students' Book Store

The purpose of the Students' Books Store is to supply books and note books to the students in time. The cost of books, not issued to students, will be refunded at the end of the year. Students are asked to

check up the individual account cards maintained in the Book Store before closing the accounts for the year. Accounts of students who leave the College during the year will be settled immediately before getting the Transfer Certificate. Students are instructed to note down the cost of books they receive for future reference.

(C) Students' Christian Movement :

The Students' Christian Movement (SCM) provides Christian values to the Protestant Christian Students of the College . The Principal is the Patron of this movement who is guided by the Chaplain. It has two Staff Advisors, a secretary and student representatives from each class. The activities are :

1. Morning worship during working days
2. Special meetings on every Tuesday.
3. Hospital visits.
4. Contribution to Blind School Students, Cancer Patients and AIDS Victims
5. Carol rounds during Christmas.

(D) Christian Education Council Diploma Class

The Christian Education Council Diploma class was initiated in our College in 1991. The syllabus for the first year students is New Testament, second year - Old Testament and third year - Christian Faith. The Classes are conducted every Wednesday evening. The annual examination is conducted in March.

(E) Language Lab :

The Language Laboratory started functioning from 2008. This computer aided lab helps the students to develop their communication skills. Training will be given to all the students in a phased manner.



8. RULES & REGULATIONS

(a) General Discipline

1. Every student has an obligation to obey the rules and regulations of the College and to respect and uphold its discipline.
Students should wear uniform dress on all working days except last working day of every month.
Boys are allowed to wear only shirts and pants.
Boys should not wear short shirts/Multicoloured shirts with pictures/
Pants with Multiple pockets/Jeans pants/T-shirts/Dhothies*.
Girls should dress modestly and should not wear transparent dresses/half Sarees.
2. The behaviour of the students should be gentlemanly. Indecent behaviour towards teachers or fellow students or others will be dealt with seriously.
3. The students should move quietly from one class room to another and maintain discipline.
4. Students should be in their classes in time, and shall sit according to their class number.
5. No student shall leave the classroom or laboratory without the permission of the teacher-in-charge.
6. Late comers shall enter the class room or laboratory only with the permission of the teacher-in-charge.
7. The cleanliness and safety of the College building and its property is the responsibility of every student. Any attempt to damage the College property would be viewed very seriously.
8. Students are prohibited from organizing or attending meetings in the College, distributing notices or hand bills or collecting money for any purpose without the permission of the Principal.
9. Students shall not address to any authority in a collective petition or make complaints to a body. All requests, petitions, complaints and appeals should be made to the Principal.
10. Every student must wear the Identity Card in the College premises.
11. Smoking and use of alcohol or intoxicating drinks or drugs are strictly prohibited.
12. The College authorities will not be responsible for misconduct or criminal offence outside the College. Students are expected to behave in a fitting manner even outside the College so as to keep up the good name of the College.

13. The boys should not enter the premises of the girls' retiring room under any circumstance.
14. Students are not permitted to bring cell phones into the campus. Violation of this rule will be viewed seriously.
15. Eve-teasing and ragging are banned in the campus. If any student indulges in eve-teasing and ragging, criminal action will be initiated against that student.
16. Male students should have their hair trimmed in a descent manner. They should have a clean-shaved face. Keeping beards and growing fancy moustache are prohibited.
17. The students are strictly warned not to track College controversy matters in social media like facebook, Whatsapp, Youtube etc. If violated strict action will be taken.
18. Any student
 - i) Who is persistently insubordinate
 - ii) Who is habitually irregular in attendance or inattentive to his work in class.
 - iii) Who is repeatedly or willfully mischievous or obscene in word or act.
 - iv) Who is guilty of fraud or malpractice in examinations
 - v) Who takes part in political agitations or in any movement causing social discord: will be removed from the rolls temporarily or permanently according to the severity of the offence.

(b) Issue of certificates

1. Transfer Certificates will be issued to students who leave the Institution, only after all the dues are paid.
2. Certificate (Transfer, conduct etc.) will be issued within a week from the date of application.
3. The Principal will not issue a certificate of pass for any University Examination.
4. Fees for the issue of certificates :

a) Duplicate Transfer Certificate	Rs. 500
b) Any information /Certificates from the College records (for passed out students)	Rs. 100 + Search fee
c) Bonafide Certificate	Rs. 50

© Attendance & Leave

1. University and College rules require regular attendance in all classes (theory and practical), Games, NCC., NSS., and other part V subjects.

2. Leave should be applied for, in advance in the form available at the office. Leave application should be addressed to the Vice-Principal/Principal through HoD.
3. Absence without the leave application is punishable with fine.
4. Attendance is taken at the beginning of each period. Absence in one class either in the morning or evening will be recorded as absence for half a day.
5. In case of unforeseen and unavoidable circumstances, the leave applications shall be submitted immediately on return after absence.
6. A student absenting himself from the College for more than 15 consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation is liable to be removed from the rolls.
7. Leave applications, in the case of illness should be countersigned by the parents or guardian. Application for sick leave for more than three days should be accompanied by medical certificate.
8. No student will be exempted from Tests or Assignments.
9. Fee concession holders and scholarship holders should have minimum 90% attendance (G.O. 666 of 24.4.1979)
10. Students have to put in 75% attendance for writing University examination without paying condonation fee to the University. Rs. 1000/- will be charged from those who have 60% to 75% attendance, and if less than 60% the semester has to be repeated.
11. The University has introduced break system from the academic year 2017-18 in which the students who repeat the semester cannot continue the course.



9. STUDENTS' COUNCIL

Students' Council Constitution

ARTICLE-I: Aim

- A. The aim of the Council is to help students engage themselves in meaningful pursuits outside the co-curricular programme of the College and to provide opportunities for training as good citizens.
- B. The Council will try to achieve these aims mainly through debates, lectures, meetings and cultural programmes.

ARTICLE II : Membership

All students of the College shall be deemed to be members of the Council, for the academic year and all members of the staff shall be its honorary members.

ARTICLE III: Office Bearers of the Executive committee

- A. The Principal is the President of the Council, and he may appoint three members of the staff to the Executive Committee of the Council, out of which one will be the Treasurer and two will be Advisors.
- B. There shall be an elected Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Joint-Secretary for the Council.
- C. The Chairman may preside over ordinary meetings of the Council. The Principal or the Vice-Principal shall preside over business and special meetings of the Council and also the meetings of the Executive Committee
- D. The secretary shall arrange the meetings of the Council in consultation with the President and Chairman and shall conduct other matters of the Council according to the decision of the President and the Executive Committee of the Council.

The Composition of Executive Committee :

1. The Principal
2. The Vice-Principal
3. The Bursar
4. Three staff members nominated by the Principal
(2 Advisors and 1 Treasurer)
5. The Chairman (Students' Council)
6. The Vice-Chairman (Students' Council)
7. The Secretary (Students' Council)
8. The joint-Secretary (Students' Council)
9. Six other elected members (Students' Council)

10. Two other students to be co-opted to the Committee on nomination by the Principal to secure fair representation.

ARTICLE IV : Election :

Mode of Election

As per the Manomaniam Sundaranar University Guidelines (Vide No. MSU/A/CO.UN.EL/2007-08), the College adopts indirect election in electing the office - bearers and the executive members of the Students Union Council. Under indirect election method, each class, I, II and III years of under graduate courses, I and II years of post graduate programmes and M.Phil. will elect a representative each and all these class representatives will form the electoral College to elect the Office - bearers and members to Executive directly.

The apex body under the proposed dispensation will be “University Students' Union”, to which the electoral College will be the students' representatives chosen from affiliated Colleges and University Departments (Chairman and Secretary). For the University Students' Union, four office bearers as in Colleges, and two student representatives from each District, Tirunelveli, Tuticorin and Kanniyakumari ($3 \times 2 = 6$), for the Executive Committee will be elected.

Eligibility of Students to contest

* A student contesting the election should be a regular full time student who has cleared all papers till the date of nomination with 75% attendance in the previous semester. The contesting candidates should not have criminal charges or affiliation to any political or communal outfit. They should not have any charges of indiscipline.

* All the students of the College shall have the right to vote and contest in the election of the Students' Council. The Chairman and the Secretary candidates shall be from the third year UG classes or second year P.G. classes or M.Phil. classes.

* Students elected as Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Joint-Secretary and Executive Committee Members of the Council shall not hold office in any other association in the College and shall resign other offices to which they may have been elected earlier.

* First year UG and PG students cannot become members of Executive Committee.

* The elections of the Chairman, Vice-chairman, Secretary, Joint-Secretary and student members of the Executive Committee will be conducted by President or by the Advisor appointed by him. Elections shall generally be by secret ballot.

* If any student is identified as guilty and fined Rs. 50/- and above, that

student shall not be eligible to contest in any of the Students' Council elections.

Grievance Cell

* A Grievance Cell constituted by the staff council will dispose off the election related disputes and complaints within 24 hours.

* The Grievance Cell will have the authority to cancel the candidature of a contestant who violates the election norms.

Code of Conduct

No election related expenditure will be permitted. Corrupt practices are totally prohibited. Wall posters, pamphlets and handbills are banned. No outsider should be allowed during the days of election process. Procession of any kind and anywhere are strictly prohibited. In the event of the violence or factional clashes, the President will cancel the whole election process and inform the decision to the University authority concerned.

Deadline for Elections

The duration of the process of election should not exceed four days in a College. The election for the University Students' Union should be completed before **December 20, 2021**.

ARTICLE V : Meetings of the Executive Committee

- A. The Executive Committee of the Council shall discuss the programme of activities at least once a semester.
- B. A notice of at least three days shall be given for meetings of the Committee by the Secretary. Urgent or special meetings may be convened on short notice on the authorization of the President.
- C. The proceedings of all the meetings of the Committee should be recorded.
- D. 50 percent shall be the quorum for the Executive meeting.
- E. The President has the right to convene the Executive Committee of the Council at any time.

The President shall have the power to issue directions for the proper conduct of meetings and other affairs of the Council and to revise the regulations. His interpretation of the regulations and his decisions in any dispute shall be final.

CODE OF CONDUCT OF THE ELECTED STUDENTS

(Vide proceedings of the Director of Collegiate Education No. 5763116/82 date 29-9-82.)

1. The office - bearers of the Students' Council shall co-operate fully with the Principal and Staff of the College in promoting intellectual and cultural activities among students.

2. The Students' Council Office-bearers shall take upon themselves the responsibility of not involving in any act of indiscipline leading to disruption of normal life in the campus.
3. The problems and issues in the College shall be resolved by representations and negotiations and not be resorting to any other method.
4. The Office-bearers shall under no circumstance deem it as part of their duty to represent to the authorities on matters and causes, which do not fall under the purview of the Council.
5. The Office-bearers may make their representations to the Principal only on matters pertaining to the general interest of the students and not on individual cases.
6. The Council Office-bearers shall not interfere directly or indirectly in matters involving discipline and action thereon, which are the responsibilities of the Principal.
7. No decision on the activities/programmes of the Council shall be taken by the Council Office-bearers except with the recommendations of the Students' Representatives Council consisting of the Office-bearers of the Department Associations and Staff Advisers with the approval of the Principal.
8. The Budget for the Council shall be prepared by the Council Office-bearers in consultation with the Students' Representatives Council and the Staff Advisers. This shall be submitted to the Principal for approval.
9. It shall be obligatory on the part of the Council Office-bearers to present the statement of accounts of the Union twice a semester to the Students' Representatives Council.
10. The Office-bearers shall not invite any outsider to the College for meetings and functions except with the approval and consent of the Principal.
11. The Council Office-bearers shall not involve themselves in any kind of fund-raising campaigns except with the specific approval of the Principal.
12. The above said instructions shall be followed and those who violate these shall be dealt with suitably.

For first and second U.G. : **Part I** - Language (Tamil/Malayalam) and **Part - II** - English. **Part-III** consists of Major and Allied Papers. **Part - IV** consists of Environmental Studies, Value Based Education, Skill Based Subjects (SBS), Non-Major Electives (NME), common paper like Yoga and Computer for Digital Era. **Part-V** consists of Extension Activity.(NSS, NCC, YRC, Sports). The details of **Part III** and **Part-IV** Subjects for UG Courses and the subjects for PG and M.Phil. are given below :

14. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The College provides students with a whole range of Co-Curricular and Extra-Curricular activities to make their campus life interesting and meaningful and mould them into matured persons.

I. COURSE REQUIREMENT

(a) National Cadet Corps. (N.C.C.) (Company III)

The 11th battalion company of the NCC has a strength of 160 Cadets (with Head Quarters at Nagercoil). The mixed battalion (boys and girls) has been functioning for the last five years. The aims of the N.C.C. are :

- i) To develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship and the ideals of selfless service among the youth to make them useful citizens.
- ii) To create a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life including the armed forces and to make them always available for the service of the nation.

The tenure of N.C.C. training is normally two years. In cases of exceptional cadets, it may be extended to one more year. The N.C.C. training consists of drill with or without arms, weapon training, map reading, bayonet-fighting, range firing with rifle and light machine gun, elementary military field tactics, study of army organization and allied subjects. Selected cadets will have the privilege of attending Annual Training Camp, Summer Training Camp, Advanced Leadership Training Camp, Republic Day Parade, Mountaineering Courses and Attachment to Army Units.

There will be 40 parades per year. Attendance is compulsory for all parades. Punctuality and good turn out and active disciplined participation is expected of all cadets.

The cadets will have the chance of appearing for B and C Certificate examinations according to the proficiency attained.

(b) National Service Scheme - N.S.S.

There are six N.S.S. units - Unit Nos. 82, 83, 135, 139, 188 and 189 under the Youth Welfare Department of the Manonmaniam Sundaranar University. The authorized strength is 100 in each unit. The aims of the N.S.S. are :

1. To work with and among people.
2. To engage in creative and constructive social action.
3. To make National Service more meaningful and purpose ful and to integrate the same with curriculum.
4. To provide an opportunity to the students to have a sense of participation in Nation - Building tasks.
5. To inculcate the spirit of national consciousness in the minds of the students.

Enrollment :

Students of degree classes with good physique and a positive attitude and who have the liking to work with and for the underprivileged alone will be enrolled. They must be fully aware of the objectives and the responsibilities. Enrollment will be completed before 1st August.

There shall be a college level N.S.S. committee under the chairmanship of the Principal with a Programme Officer as Convenor. The committee may consist of not more than 10 and shall include some senior members of staff, students and leading citizens interested in the scheme. This Advisory Committee may chalk out the programmes for the year. A minute book for recording the proceedings of the advisory committee should be maintained.

The N.S.S. programme officers will give further details regarding the projects and programmes.

c) Extension Service - Village adoption

As a part of the extension activities of the college, we have adopted the village, Vattaparai, near Arukani, Vilavancode Taluk. It is socially and economically a very backward village. The objectives in adopting these village are :

- ⊙ To conduct community development programmes.
- ⊙ To encourage adult education and literacy programmes.
- ⊙ To conduct environmental awareness programmes
- ⊙ To conduct social work camps with the help of the N.G.Os,
- ⊙ To make the people aware of Govt. welfare schemes.
- ⊙ To have health and hygiene awareness camps.
- ⊙ To give education to the local people on numerous rights.
- ⊙ To create awareness among the people about consumer problems.

(d) Physical Education :

There are facilities for the following games, Foot Ball, Volley Ball, Tennis, Shuttle Cock, Ball Badminton, Cricket, Tennikoit and Throw Ball. Training is given for all athletic events. There are facilities for indoor games like Table-Tennis, Chess and Caroms. Intra-mural tournaments are conducted by the College. Inter-collegiate tournaments are organized by the University. The college team also participates in the events conducted by other organizations locally and at the district level.

Students of all classes with aptitude and interest are always welcome to use the facilities for sports and games in the college.

Further particulars and details will be available from the concerned department from time to time.

(e) Youth Red Cross :

The aim of Youth Red Cross is to train student volunteers to render humanitarian services, to care the health of sick & suffering people. It also encourages students for voluntary Blood Donation. Interested students may join.
