The Plan for 2004-'05

- To give Computer education to 60 students of Humanities.
- To arrange seminars in Physical Sciences, Biological Sciences, Humanities, Computer Science, Management Studies & Commerce.
- To conduct Faculty Development Programme on the basis of Students' feed back on teachers, also to update teaching skill.
- To publish papers in national/international journals.
- To identify malnourished and sick students and guide them to have medical treatment.
- To introduce martial arts for self defense – 'Kalari' fight for boys and Karate for girls.
- To encourage departments to adopt schools.
- To develop a soft-ware for collecting students feed back and prepare an analysis.
- To develop a data base for all faculty with semester-wise subjects taught and hours for each subjects.
- To prepare students' progress report for five unit tests and model test and send them to their parents.
- To store daily attendance of students in computer.
- To encourage teachers to use audio-visual teaching facility.
- To use Information and Computer Technology (ICT) in as many areas as possible
- To make the faculty to understand the importance of the five values added to the seven criteria for the purpose of re-accreditation as suggested by NAAC.
- To send minor and major project proposals to UGC.

- To conduct UGC sponsored Career-Oriented Programme.
- To encourage students to avail themselves PLUS scholarship programme offered by United States of America.
- To start Centre for Entrepreneurship Development (CED) cell in our College to motivate the students to assert their self-sustainability.
- To establish Placement Cell of the University.
- To introduce self-financed PG courses like – M.Sc. (Botany) & M.Phil. (Mathematics).
- To construct two houses to homeless tribals and a house to homeless student of our college.
- To construct a new block for the Botany department.
- To have Link with DELNET – Developing Library Network, New Delhi.

The outcome:

- On the basis of the feed back from the students, a one day Orientation Programme and a Seminar on pedagogy were conducted.
- Teachers presented papers on Conferences, and five papers were published in reputed journals.
- For self defence, "Kalari" fights for boys have been conducted in the campus.
- A software has been developed by the Department of Computer Science for preparing feed back analysis.
- A database for all faculty members has been created which consists of the subject hours they taught. Attendance work has been computerized.
- Teachers are using OHP and LCD to complement Audio-Visual teaching.
- Office work has been computerized.
- A Computer and Printer have been provided to each department to carry out Departmental work.
- Staff were informed of the importance of five values enforced by the NAAC.
- Proposals for one Major Project and 3 Minor Projects have been sent.
- UGC has sanctioned Rs.17 lakhs to start the following 9 Career Oriented Programmes, 3 courses each in Arts, Science and Commerce.

- Ten students appeared in the PLUS Scholarships programme offered by United States of America
- A placement cell of the University has been started; 30 students got placement through campus interview. Our Institution got ISO 9001: 2000 Certification, certified by B.S.I.
- Progress report for unit tests and 1 model test have been sent regularly.
- Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has motivated the faculty to send proposals for projects and seminars to the U.G.C. It has also been involved in the process of preparing the institution for re-accreditation.
- The Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, through Centre for Entrepreneurship Development (CED) – Tamil Nadu, sanctioned Rs.11,000 to conduct Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp.

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The mission and goals of the College have always been to impart and spread knowledge, to cultivate humanistic traits and to mould the intellectual, emotional and spiritual character of one's personality with a view to dispelling ignorance and darkness. It is also to inform and transform the most backward people of Vilavancode and Kalkulam taluks of Kanyakumari District. It is to make the rural folk realize their worth and potentiality and help them march forward.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction:

We have strengthened audio visual education with the help of OHP & LCD.

Ours, being a rural college has a lot of First Generation learners (90%). They are poor in English. Spoken English class has been started by the BBA and B.A. Tourism departments. Educational English movies were also screened for the purpose with the help of LCD.

Departments of Computer Science, Business Administration, Tourism & Computer Applications have conducted national, inter-collegiate and inter-departmental competitions.

Students from the Departments of English, Tamil, Physics, Computer Science, Tourism have attended seminars, presented papers and won prizes in Quiz Competitions.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started:

The department of Computer Applications and Management Studies have been conducting inter-collegiate competitions every year – EUGINIX, GLEAMS, BOOT.

5. Examination reforms implemented:

We are not an Autonomous institution and so change in Examination pattern could be done only by the university. Members representing Board of Studies etc. have been advocating a flexible system of syllabi and examination in Senate and Syndicate meetings.

The College has an Examination Committee to oversee the completion of portions and conducting unit and model tests regularly. Thus students are continuously assessed.

Staff, students and the management through the Extension Service Committee and NSS constructed three houses to homeless tribals in the adopted village – Pathukani, Kanyakumari District and a house to a homeless student in Enayam (K.K. Dist).

- Teachers contribute every month towards the treatment of poor cancer patients at International Cancer Centre, Neyyoor, Kanyakumari District – Total Rs.47,000/- per year.
- Meals and clothes were given to the children of Blind School, Irenepuram. For this the college spent Rs. 12,925/- (Dress – Rs.5,500/- and for Meals Rs. 7,425/-).
- The college provided Rs.17,277-50 to the Karunya Rehabilitation Centre for Mentally ill, Tholadi, Kanyakumari District. Apart from that amount Rs.4,500/- was given to the mentally ill center as festival gift.
