For the radio astronomer the moon has an over-whelming advantage, At the centre of the far side, he will be permanently shielded from all the electrical 'noise' and interference of the earth's civilization by 2,000 miles of solid rock. To the geologist the moon represents a bonanza of mere value than all the gold mines ever found, What we learn about the evolution and geological history 'of the' moon may shed light on the origin of the earth.
